CONDITIONS & REGULATIONS OF ACCEPTANCE

Course Fee (the course runs Mon to Fri): £2,475 (students start on Monday and finish on Friday after presentations)

Accommodation is available at £82 per night, with a minimum of 5-night stay

- 1) Students attending the programme are reminded that the following rules apply (in conjunction with the College Student Rules & House Accommodation rules) and must be strictly adhered to.
- 2) Full fees for the course must be paid in advance, by the specified invoice due date.
- 3) Cherwell College Oxford reserves the right to request the withdrawal of a student for any behaviour which might be considered detrimental to the smooth running of the course, or which might interfere with the studies of other students. Students may be withdrawn from the course for any serious breach of the College Student Rules and/or Accommodation House rules. Any refund of fees will be at a sole discretion of the College.
- 4) Students and their fee payers will accept full liability for any damage to property caused by malice or neglect.
- 5) The College will not be liable for loss or damage to personal property.
- 6) Tutorials agreed and accounted for must be attended. There will be no refund for non-attendance or cancellation.
- 7) Students who leave their room in an unnecessarily untidy condition, whose behaviour or actions cause extra costs to the College or fail to return their College keys will be directly liable for such costs and will receive a supplementary account.
- 8) No alcoholic beverages are allowed to be consumed in the student's room or in any other part of the College's premises. Failure to abide by the College Student and/or House Accommodation Rules will result in immediate expulsion from the course.
- 9) The College reserves the right to use other premises for teaching or the Halls of Residence for accommodation should the need arise.
- 10) Due to the ongoing nature of the Covid-19 pandemic, the College reserves the right to suspend in-person teaching and transition to online learning, either partially or fully, if deemed necessary to mitigate health risks.
